

Flea Instruction

- 1) Take pets to be professionally treated by a Veterinarian or a pet groomer on the same day of the flea treatment.
- 2) Vacuum the entire house, paying particular attention to carpeted areas; on and underneath furniture and in areas where the pets frequent the most.
- 3) Dispose of vacuum bag when finished.
- 4) Remove and clean all pet's bedding.
- 5) The floor surfaces should be cleared of as many objects as possible, particularly underneath beds, to give the serviceman access to these critical areas.
- 6) All exposed food should be put away in closed cabinets or in the refrigerator.
- 7) Exposed pet food and water should be put away or discarded.
- 8) If cats, litter boxes should be emptied and washed.
- 9) If you are experiencing any problems in the bedrooms, or if the pets frequent these areas, the linens should be stripped and washed. Leave the bedding stripped for our treatment. We will use a hand held aerosol on beds and sofas if necessary.
- 10) Fish tanks need to be properly covered in plastic and the aerator shut off.
- 11) All people and pets (not caged) must be out of the house for about 3 to 4 hours upon the serviceman's arrival. If caged pets remain in the home, cages should be off the floor. If the air conditioning or heating is in use, it should be turned off while technician is servicing and turned back on when the technician is finished.
- 12) Allow 2 weeks for the full results of the insecticide and growth regulator.
- 13) Frequent vacuuming for 2 to 3 weeks after service is recommended. Floors should not be washed during that time.
